THIRD SUNDAY IN ADVENT

“Rejoice always,” begins the reading from First Thessalonians. Isaiah and the psalmist make clear that God is turning our mourning into laughter and shouts of joy. “All God’s children got a robe,” go the words of the spiritual. It is not so much a stately, formal, pressed outfit as it is a set of party clothes, clothes that make us feel happy just to put on. We receive that robe in baptism, and in worship we gather for a foretaste of God’s party.

In his fashion-forward sermon, "Who Are You Wearing?" Pastor Jim shows us how to consistently be the best-dressed person at any party this season.

The Sacrament today will be administered by intinction. If you are visiting with us and believe as we do that in the Sacrament we receive God’s gift of life and forgiveness, if you are a baptized member of the Christian Church, we hope you will join us at the Lord’s table. Please note that we also have gluten free hosts.

During Advent:

- our paraments are blue, the color of hope
- our baptismal font with a baptismal candle is at the entry way of our church reminding us that this is how we begin our faith journey
- our confessional is led from the font each week
- our Advent banners are hung
- there are no regular altar candles or flowers
- special aisle candles decorated in blue remind us of this season of hope
- our choirs are not processing
- our Advent Wreath will be lit during the Prelude
- we sing a psalm response between our first and second lesson
- our Hymn of Praise is omitted
- a congregational response, the refrain of *O Come, O Come, Emanuel*, will be sung in place of the Alleluia verse
- we use the Nicene Creed
- we hear reflective music during communion distribution
- we gather each Wednesday at 12:15 & 7:30 p.m. for the Eucharist, to prepare for the coming of Christ
- we begin a new year of Gospel readings with most coming from St. Mark

Advent devotionals are available in the Narthex.

Our Lessons:

Isaiah 61:1-4, 8-11. Though the people had returned to Jerusalem from exile in Babylon, they continued to face hardship and oppression. In the language of the jubilee year described in Leviticus 25, the prophet, moved by the spirit of the Lord, announces deliverance for those who are oppressed and comfort for those who mourn.

1 Thessalonians 5:16-24. Paul concludes his letter to the Thessalonians by encouraging them to live lives of continual joy, prayers, and thanksgiving. The closing blessing is grounded in the hope of Christ’s coming.

John 1:6-8, 19-28. John’s Gospel describes Jesus as the “light of the world.” John the Baptist is presented as a witness to Jesus, one who directs attention away from himself to Christ, the true light.

TYING IT ALL TOGETHER:

The prophet reminds God’s people that the Jubilee Year is coming, and it’s time to get ready to celebrate the redemption, restoration and rebalancing of people and planet. The coming of God’s kingdom promises to transform every aspect of our lives together. In anticipation and preparation, God gives God’s people new clothes and a whole set of lavish accessories to put on -- salvation, joy, praise, peace, righteousness, love, mercy, gratitude and on and on. St. Paul picks up the proclamation and instructs the Thessalonians to put on their joy and celebrate the Advent of the Christ, and John the Baptist, in his best leather belt and camel-hair coat, points to the coming light, then shows us the way to the bath. The time is near. The party’s ready to begin. So, who are you wearing, this year?

It's Pledge Response Time

Faith's Grateful Response has 164 pledges totaling \$625,027 toward the 2012 budget. This generous response by the Family shows our continuing commitment to the needs of many, both near and far. However, as we reach year-end and the Church Council plans for 2012, we need everyone in the Family to respond in order to support our ministry goals.

In December, our stewardship appeals highlight examples of ministries that encompass caring and sharing.

The Christmas Sharing Tree has been in the Narthex this fall and many of you have taken a tag to purchase a desired gift. For this ministry, Faith members collect Christmas presents for distribution to several organizations in the local area, including Community Service Association of New Providence, ARC of Union County, Possum Way Group Home in New Providence, St. Stephan's Grace Lutheran Church in Newark, and Cheshire Home in Florham Park. This year, the children at St. Stephan's have asked that donations include a small gift along with a monetary donation to support the ELCA's campaign against malaria. In 2010, 111 gifts were collected, including 30 from Faith Nursery School and Faith's staff.

The family, through its benevolences, supports the Chaplaincy services at both Overlook and Morristown Hospitals. Each hospital receives \$350 from Faith to support the Chaplaincy services, which offers spiritual care to patients and their families. A Chaplain will visit upon request and an Interfaith Chapel is available, along with special services for different faiths.

The Liturgy is the Message

One of the wonderful gifts of the liturgy is its ability to communicate the Gospel to us. The four week Advent season is a rich reminder of Christ's coming in each of our lives, and of our need to prepare for that gift. Page one of our Family Notes lists all the liturgy changes that emphasize this waiting time. Notice also the musical variations that will occur during these coming weeks.

Advent 1 -We have a Prelude and Postlude.

Advent 2 - We have just a Prelude.

Advent 3 - **We will not have a closing hymn or music after worship.**

Advent 4 - We will worship with a minimum of music, using the "O Antiphons."

As we move closer to Christmas, and our world becomes more frenzied, the growing simplicity of our liturgy will call us to quiet reflection of God's awesome gift.
