TRANSFIGURATION OF OUR LORD

Today's festival is a bridge between the Advent-Christmas-Epiphany cycle that comes to a close today and the Lent-Easter cycle that begins Wednesday. On the mount of transfiguration Jesus is revealed as God's beloved Son, echoing the words at his baptism. This vision of glory sustains us as Jesus faces his impending death in Jerusalem.

We turn this week to Ash Wednesday and our yearly baptismal journey from Lent to Easter. Some churches put aside the alleluia at the conclusion of today's liturgy. This word of joy will be omitted during the penitential season of Lent and will be sung again at Easter.

Pastor Mac's, "*It's a Secret,*" reminds us of this day's special ties to Easter...and to Lent.

The Sacrament today will be administered by intinction. If you are visiting with us and believe as we do that in the Sacrament we receive God's gift of life and forgiveness, if you are a baptized member of the Christian Church, we hope you will join us at the Lord's table. Gluten free wafers are available at both stations

Our Lessons:

Exodus 24:12-18. At Mount Sinai, Moses experienced the presence of God for forty days and forty nights. The "glory of the Lord" settled on the mountain, and on the seventh day God called out to Moses. On the mountain God gave Moses the stone tablets inscribed with the ten commandments.

2 Peter 1:16-21. At the transfiguration, God's voice was heard, declaring Jesus to be the beloved Son. By the activity of the Holy Spirit, God's voice continues to be heard through the word of scripture.

Matthew 17:1-9. Shortly before he enters Jerusalem, where he will be crucified, Jesus is revealed to his disciples in a mountaintop experience of divine glory called the transfiguration.

TYING IT ALL TOGETHER:

All of our readings from scripture today speak of mountain top experiences, of special encounters between God and humanity. Moses, the prophet extraordinaire, encounters God on Mt. Sinai and receives the Ten Commandments. He is truly transformed by this experience. Our reading from 2 Peter speaks of being shown the glory of God found in Jesus Christ. This is a vision that comes only through the work of the Holy Spirit in our midst. Finally, on a high mountain, Matthew's Gospel connects the glory of God with the path of discipleship. Coming down from the mountain top, Jesus tells his disciples that the cross is on the horizon. Only through the cross do we see the true magnitude of God's glory.

Green Food for Thought **Modern Christian Thought on God's creation:** "Catholic teaching about the stewardship of creation leads us to question certain farming practices, such as the operation of massive confined animal feeding operations. We believe that these operations should be carefully regulated and monitored so that environmental risks are minimized and animals are treated as creatures of God." (from *For I was Hungry and You Gave Me Food: Catholic Reflections on Food, Farmers, and Farmworkers*, U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, 2003)

Green Tip: For short trips, try walking instead of hopping in the car. Even at a leisurely pace, you'll burn about 100 calories per mile. Plus, walking a mile a day instead of

driving will save you about fifteen cents a day, and walking instead of driving 10 one-mile trips a week will avert about 500 pounds of CO₂ emissions in a year.

Stewardship of Time and Talents

Each month, the Stewardship Committee tries to show how our financial pledges, and the volunteering of our time and talent, are contributing to Faith's many areas of outreach. March is traditionally the month when Faith focuses on hunger outreach, and one of our most important ministries is our support, both in treasure and time, of the St. John's Soup Kitchen in Newark.

For more than 25 years, Faith Lutheran Church has contributed food, volunteers, and financial support to the St. John's Soup Kitchen Ministries. Chris Bjornstad and Ellen Rosenkrantz are the coordinators of the Faith mission to St. John's. On the 2nd Saturday of each month, they organize nearly 20 bakers and 15 servers to provide meals for approximately 300 to 400 people at St. John's. In the summer, the number of meals we provide jumps to over 400. We are the only church committed to providing the complete meal one weekend a month at St. John's, including homemade desserts. Our bakers donate their own ingredients in addition to their time and talent.

Help from Faith Lutheran made it possible for St. John's to open their Women and Children's Center, a separate dining facility within the church. On typical mornings, they will serve 80 breakfasts for these families.

The need at St. John's is expected to continue growing. With the season of Lent now upon us, St. John's offers us a wonderful opportunity to use our time and talents toward a ministry with true impact on people's lives. 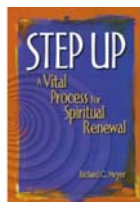

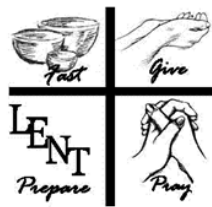
