## *FOURTH SUNDAY IN LENT* *Lenten Liturgy*

Today we share in a special Lenten Liturgy as we reach this mid-point in Lent.

**B**aptism is sometimes called enlightenment. The Gospel for this Sunday is the story of the man born blind who is healed by Christ. I was blind, but now I see, declares the man. In Baptism God opens our eyes to see the truth of who we are: God's beloved sons and daughters. As David was anointed king of Israel, in baptism God anoints our head with oil, and calls us to bear witness to the light of Christ in our daily lives.

In his sermon, "Why Can't You See? You Belong to Me!" Pastor Jim walks us through Psalm 23 to show us how Jesus has brought us into God's family and daily provides us all that we truly need in life.

As we continue this penitential season, please note:

- our Baptismal Font moves from the door towards the altar as we move toward Jerusalem
- a Lenten Center is at the foot of the cross
- there are no flowers on our altar
- we move to setting 4 of our liturgy
- we omit the Hymn of Praise
- we sing a psalm response between our first and second lesson
- our Lenten Sentence replaces the Alleluia
- a guided meditation in Family Notes gives direction to our reflection during communion
- there are no communion hymns
- our cross (made out of Christmas trees, to remind us that the baby at Bethlehem is the Christ of the Cross) is draped in purple, a penitential color
- draped aisle torches highlight this season
- there is no postlude

The Sacrament today will be administered by intinction. If you are visiting with us and believe as we do that in the Sacrament we receive God's gift of life and forgiveness, if you are a baptized member of the Christian Church, we hope you will join us at the Lord's table. Gluten free wafers are available at both stations

### **GUIDED MEDITATION:**

I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father in eternity, and also a true human being, born of the virgin Mary, is my Lord. He has redeemed me, a lost and condemned human being. He has purchased and freed me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil, not with gold or silver but with his holy, precious blood and with his innocent suffering and death. He has done all this in order that I may belong to him, live under him in his kingdom, and serve him in eternal righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as he is risen from the dead and lives and rules eternally. This is most certainly true. -- Luther's Small Catechism

### **Our Lessons:**

1 Samuel 16:1-13. Samuel anointed David even though he was the eighth-oldest son of Jesse and did not match his brothers in height or other physical characteristics. With the anointing came endowment with the Spirit of the Lord, designating David as the Lord's chosen successor to Saul.

Ephesians 5:8-14. Because we now live in the divine light that is Jesus Christ, we conduct our lives in ways that reflect the light of Christ, so that our activity is truly pleasing to God.

John 9:1-41. Jesus heals a man born blind, provoking a hostile reaction that he regards as spiritual blindness to the things of God. **(We invite you to sit today for the reading of the Gospel.)**

### **TYING IT ALL TOGETHER:**

God sends the prophet Samuel to Jesse's family to anoint a new king. God chooses the shepherd boy David, an unlikely candidate for monarch, by telling Samuel that God sees things differently from human beings who are often blinded by outward appearances. In the Gospel, Jesus heals a man born blind, but this amazing miracle points to Jesus as God's light that drives away darkness and opens our eyes to God's reality. St. Paul urges the Ephesians to live their lives in the daylight of Christ's love, grace and righteousness, now that the eyes of their hearts have been opened by God's Holy Spirit. But it's the shepherd king David who brings it all together with the simple words that open Psalm 23, "The LORD is our shepherd, we lack for nothing." What an eye-opening experience to see that God is with us, providing everything we need for this life and life in the world to come!
