## DAY OF PENTECOST

Today's festival derives its name from the Jewish festival of Pentecost, observed fifty days after Passover. On the fiftieth day of Easter we celebrate the Holy Spirit as the power of God among us that heals, forgives, inspires, and unites. In the reading from Acts, images of wind and fire describe the Spirit poured out on disciples of all nations. In John's Gospel the risen Christ breathes the Spirit on his followers on Easter evening. In the one Spirit we are baptized into one body, and at the Lord's table the Spirit unites us for witness in the world.

Pastor Mac's sermon, "*Led By The Spirit*," reminds us of God's gifts which enable us to live as a grace filled, Spirit filled servant people..

The Sacrament today will be administered by intinction. If you are visiting with us and believe as we do that in the Sacrament we receive God's gift of life and forgiveness, if you are a baptized member of the Christian Church, we hope you will join us at the Lord's table. Please note that we now also have gluten free hosts.

### Our Lessons:

Acts 2:1-21. Pentecost was a Jewish harvest festival that marked the fiftieth day after Passover. Luke portrays the Holy Spirit being poured out upon the disciples before the gathered and astonished people assembled in Jerusalem for the festival. Filled with the Spirit, the disciples were able to witness to the power of Christ's resurrection.

1 Corinthians 12:3b-13. Paul is helping the Corinthians understand the relationship between our God-given unity and Spirit-created diversity. The Spirit creates the unity of faith and gives all Christians diverse gifts for the common benefit of all. We need one another's diverse spiritual gifts, because the same Spirit has given them to each person for the common good.

John 20:19-23. The risen Jesus appears to his disciples, offering them a benediction, a commission, and the gift of the Holy Spirit.

### TYING IT ALL TOGETHER:

All of our readings today focus on the gift of the Holy Spirit. Acts tells the story of Jesus' disciples who have been gathering together as the Church since the death and resurrection of Jesus. They have been praying and eating together in Jerusalem. On the Jewish Festival of Pentecost, the disciples were all together in one place. And the Spirit of God rested upon them – and the Church in mission was born! Empowered by the Spirit, the disciples would take the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the entire known world. One of the places that the Gospel would be taken was the city of Corinth. The church there was struggling with how to live together in Christian community. Though some claimed to be more important than others, Paul reminds them that all spiritual gifts come from the Spirit. The Spirit empowers each Christian with a variety of gifts, abilities and strengths so that the over all mission of the Church might be accomplished. In our Gospel we are reminded that the Spirit connects Christians with the life changing ministry of Jesus. Through the Holy Spirit, we are able to receive God's gifts of faith and forgiveness. It is these gifts that enable us to live as the children of God.

Our Pentecost Celebration is enriched today as we thank God for the young people of our community who will be affirming their baptismal vows at the 11:00 a.m. liturgy. We thank God for the work of the Spirit in:

*Caring for Creation Now!*

#### Green Food for Thought

**Modern Christian Thought on God's creation:** "The earthly result of human sin has been a perverted stewardship, a patchwork of garden and wasteland in which the waste is increasing. "There is no faithfulness, no love, no acknowledgement of God in the land...Because of this the land mourns, and all who live in it waste away" (Hosea 4:1,3). Thus, one consequence of our misuse of the earth is an unjust denial of God's created bounty to other human beings, both now and in the future." (from *An Evangelical Declaration on the Care of Creation*, by the Evangelical

Environmental Network, 1994 )

Green Tip - To reduce dependence on petroleum, buy clothes made with natural fibers, such as cotton, hemp, bamboo, and wool, and made with all-natural dyes (such as vegetable dyes or herbal dyes). Or better still, consider buying clothing made of recycled fibers. By wearing all-natural or recycled fiber clothes, you'll be helping the environment by avoiding cloth that required a lot of energy and waste to produce, and you'll be helping yourself by avoiding irritating and uncomfortable synthetic fibers and unhealthy chemical dyes.
